## I. Causes of the Black Death

- a. The Crusades sparked trade and a merchant middle class begins trading goods between the Middle East and Europe
- b. Bubonic plague was carried by fleas and rats in ships and cargo on trade routes
- c. Spread from Asia to the Middle East and then to Europe
- 2. II. Europe's reaction to the Plague
  - a. People turned to magic and witchcraft to explain the plague
  - b. People fled cities or hid in their homes
  - c. Christians blamed the Jews
- 3. III. Effects of the Black Death
  - a. 1/3 of Europe's population died
  - b. Food production declined
  - c. Inflation
  - d. Peasant revolts were common
