

Effects of European Exploration in Asia & Africa

- I. East Asia
 - a. China
 - i. The Qing dynasty maintained the Ming policy of restricting foreign trade.
 - ii. Rejects diplomatic trade negotiations with Britain
 - b. Korea
 - i. Restricts contacts with the outside world
 - ii. Confucianism influences Korean's view of merchants
 - iii. Koreans imprison or kill shipwrecked Europeans
 - c. Japan
 - i. The Tokugawa shogunate expels foreign missionaries and isolates Japan from Westerners
- II. Africa
 - a. Europeans encourage the Atlantic slave trade
 - b. Europeans rely on African rulers and traders to seize captives and bring them to trading posts for slave trade
 - c. Some African leaders, such as Affonso I, try to stop the slave trade
